The Church of England has issued the following recommendation:

We strongly advise that face coverings should be worn by all those attending a place of worship, including ministers, worshippers, staff, volunteers, contractors and visitors, where there may be other people present; remembering that they are mainly intended to protect other people, not the wearer, from coronavirus COVID-19 and that they are not a replacement for physical distancing and regular hand washing.



The compassion of Jesus can reach out to others through our willingness to give and share.

Imagine you are Jesus. You have just heard that John the Baptist has been savagely killed. You need time to be by yourself so you go to a deserted place to be quiet, to think and to pray. What do you think when a great crowd of people catch up with you wanting answers and in some cases healing.

Many of us, faced with such a situation, would tell the people to go, leave me alone, I need some time to myself. Not with Jesus, though. He recognised that the people who had followed him were tired after a long walk and hungry. He had compassion for them and healed those who were sick. He then asked his disciples to share all the food they had with the people who numbered about 5000.

When I hear this I think back to my visit to the Sea of Galilee 25 years ago where I walked near to where this took place. Also to the re-enactment during an open air performance of 'The Life of Christ' at Wintershall, near Guildford.

This time, though, I recalled a service in Iona Abbey on a stormy October evening. The walk to the abbey from the cottage I was staying in was quite a battle against the wind and the rain. The service was wonderful as usual and at the end, as we left, we were each asked to take a piece of bread from a basket and share it with someone we did not know over coffee. That simple act was quite profound and suddenly everyone was talking to strangers and sharing their own experiences. I felt uplifted and from memory I am sure the storm had ended in time for my walk back to the cottage. Richard.
