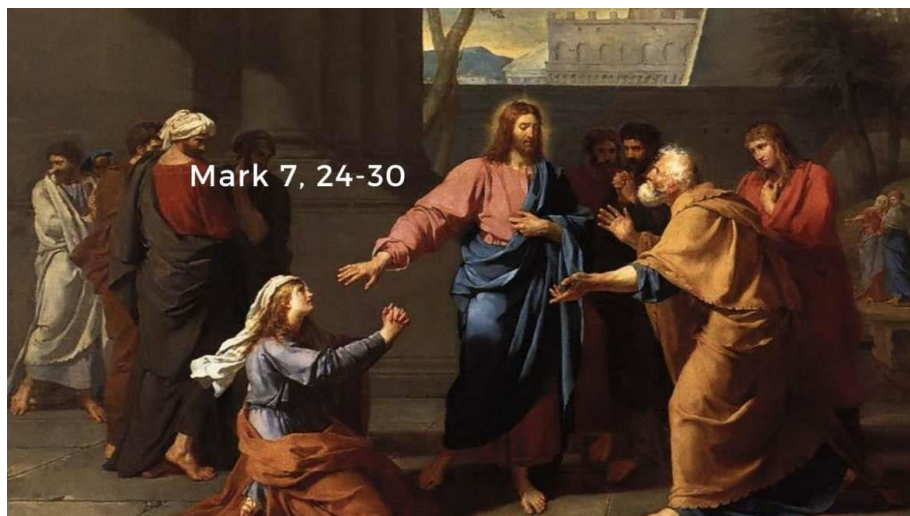

In the twenty years that the **Ride and Stride** has been running in Surrey over £300,000 has been raised. 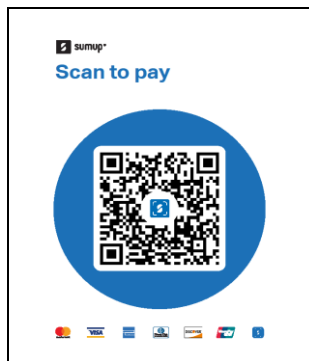
