

Breathe is back - Sunday August 16 at 3.00pm

Some of you may have attended **Breathe** during Lent in 2019, It is a valuable time for quiet prayer and contemplation in the Lady Chapel or beyond, helped by the presence of the sacrament and candles on the altar and some soft music. Even with all the limitations caused by the pandemic many of us find our lives are too busy and we find it difficult to spend quality time with our Lord.

The church I attended as a young man held an all-night vigil on Maundy Thursday and I would often sit in church alone from 1.00am to 2.00am, facing an altar adorned with candles, flowers and the sacrament. I was often tired after a hard day's work but it was a good discipline and I look back on those silent hours as times I felt close to Jesus and could pray without rushing. If words did not come that did not matter as it gave God a chance to speak to me.

In Sunday's gospel we hear of a woman keen to get to Jesus so he could heal her daughter. Her perseverance showed great faith and impressed Jesus and he answered her prayer by healing her daughter. Sometimes we feel our prayers, particularly when we are praying for a miracle, are not being answered but we must persevere with our prayers, showing Jesus we have strong faith and our prayers may then be answered, sometimes in an unexpected way.

If you have not attended **Breathe** before why not give it a try. The church is the coolest place in Lingfield during a heatwave. Breathe will be held on alternate Sundays 3.00pm to 3.45pm starting Sunday August 16. Richard.
