

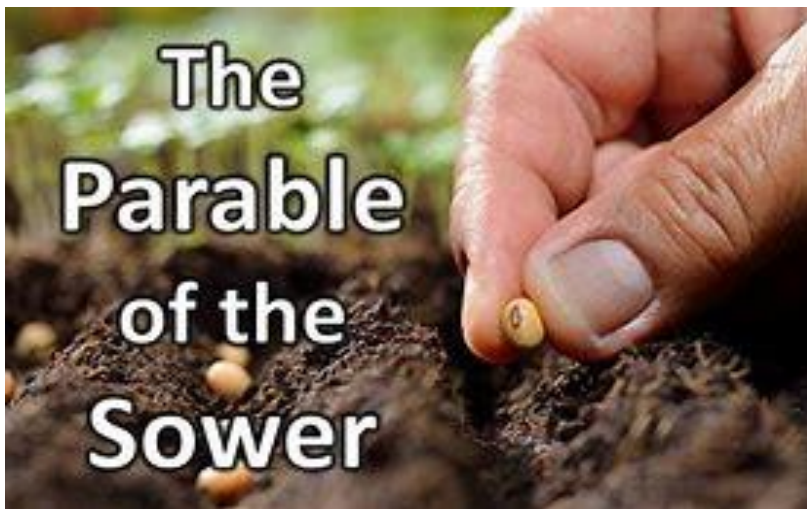

**Possible closure of Lingfield Station ticket office** – The Department of Transport (DfT) has instructed the Rail Delivery Group (RDG) to cut costs which may result in the closure of up to 1000 staffed local ticket offices, including Lingfield Station.

You can submit your opinion to [ticketoffice.GTR@transportfocus.org.uk](mailto:ticketoffice.GTR@transportfocus.org.uk) before **July 26**.
