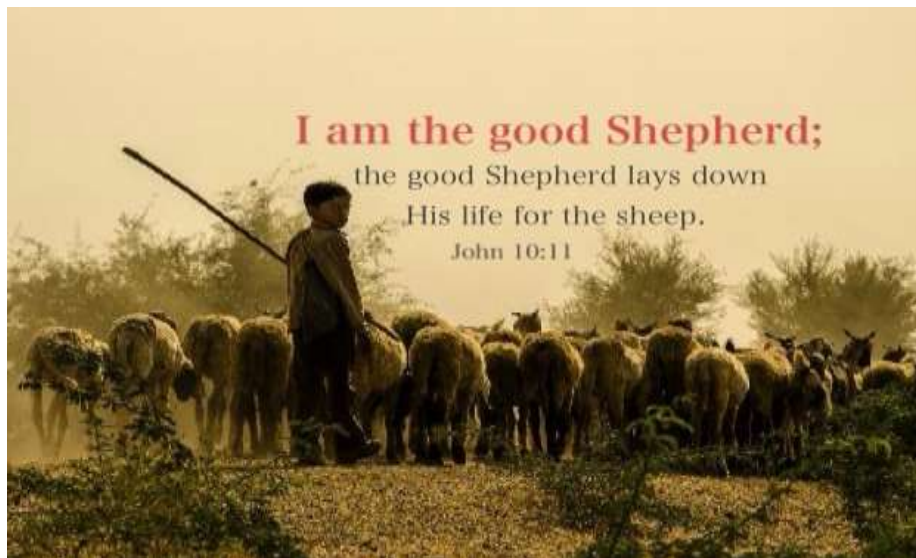

Rest in Peace - We remember Nancy Smith, Sue Page, Keith Smith, Peter Ainsworth, Ernie Borer, Hazel Russell and all those who have died recently. We recall all whose anniversary falls at this time, including others known to us.

Peter Ainsworth – Peter, who died on April 6, was our local MP for East Surrey for many years and lived in the first house by our church gates. He was also a Patron of the College of St Barnabas.

Just before lockdown the transport team collected her. She always sat in the back pew. In her younger days she worked hard for the church in many ways.
