The Original Victory in Europe Celebrations

At 3:00 PM BST on May the 8th 1945, the Prime Minister informed the nation of the Victory in Europe. The residents of our village would have been overjoyed to hear this announcement, made by Winston Churchill via radio broadcast, through their valve radio receiver sets. On hearing his voice, many would have felt proud to recall Churchill and his family living on the outskirts of their village at the time of the First World War. Between 1917 and 1919, when Winston was Minister of Munitions, he moved his young family to Lullenden in Hollow Lane, to avoid the bombing in London.

Across the land people celebrated the happy occasion by having street parties and dances and at Dormans Land there was no exception. Members of the Memorial Club were treated to a celebratory dance and here we see a photograph with over 70 villagers enjoying themselves at "The Club", as it was once fondly known.



Edwin Fry, of Crowhurstlands Farm Cottages, is standing in the middle with his daughter Aggie sitting to the right of him, behind them is Ken Saunders and his wife lifting up Jean Craft so she could be in the photo. Jean's mother Lily Craft, who was the landlady of the Royal Oak, is standing to the left of the woman holding her wrist. Behind Ken Saunders are Pat 'Paddy' and Win Hughes (née Burt) from the Homes of St. Barnabas.

The three men kneeling at the front are, from the left, Norman Warren who lived at 4 St. Clair Cottages, Hollow Lane, a passionate supporter and player of local cricket and football. Next is Herb Gibb who lived at View Terrace, Herb served in the R.A.F. during WWI and played the euphonium in Dormans Land's Brass Band, he was also known for his superb singing voice and sang in St. John's Choir. To the right of Herb is Arthur Peskett, another band member, who played the bass drum.

Sixth from the left and sitting on the floor is Thelma Wallis of 12 View Terrace. Nineteen year old Jean Coxall is standing behind Herb Gibb, Jean married Charlie Chantler in 1947. The dapper young man at the back wearing a dickie bow is twenty-two year old Bert Bryant. Bert played the cornet in our village band and lived at 41 New Farthingdale for many years with his wife Eileen and daughter Susan.

Picture the playground at Dormansland Rec. The laughter of children, the creak of swings, and the shout of "Watch this!" from the top of

the climbing frame. After school, in the summer months especially, it's a real centre of activity.

There's a group of us, working with Tandridge District Council and Tandridge Access Group, to raise money to refurbish the playground and make it inclusive. An inclusive playground is not just a space with a ramp to the slide or a quiet corner. It's a space built from the ground up with everyone in mind – children of all abilities, backgrounds, and needs. It's where sensory panels sit alongside climbing frames, where wheelchair-accessible roundabouts spin and can be used by all, and where shaded quiet zones offer a break from stimulation without removing children from the action.

But the beauty of an inclusive playground isn't just in the equipment. It's in the message it sends: **you belong here**.

Inclusion, in any setting, is about more than access. It's about participation, dignity, and joy. It's the difference between "you can come if you can keep up" and "this was made with you in mind."

In villages like ours, this principle matters more than ever. As our communities grow more diverse - whether through age, ability, culture, or experience - we're challenged to ask: are our common spaces, our groups, our traditions, built with everyone in mind?

What if young and old were encouraged to mix, learn, and play together?

What if we designed our spaces, our programmes, and our gatherings not for the "average person" (whoever that is), but for the richness of human diversity? Once complete, and there's a very long way to go (everyone can help fundraise), it will be a real, tangible place that shows what's possible when we start by asking, "Who might be left out?" and follow it with, "How can we make space for them?"

The thing is though, that inclusion isn't just about helping "them" - it transforms us. Children who grow up playing side by side with people different from themselves learn empathy, resilience, and friendship. Adults who live in inclusive communities find their lives enriched by unexpected relationships and shared strength.

We all benefit when everyone can play their part.

And for those of us shaped by Christian faith, inclusion goes even deeper. Jesus constantly reached out to those on the margins - the excluded, the overlooked, the "left out." He didn't just make room at the table - He expanded the table until everyone had a place.

The vision of God's Kingdom is one where barriers are broken, strangers become neighbours, and no one is left standing outside the gate. It's not just about accessibility - it's about love in action. The kind of love that says, "You matter. You belong. You are welcome here."

So next time you pass the village playground - whether filled with laughter or waiting for the next round of joyful chaos - remember: inclusion begins in places like that. It begins with welcome, design, and imagination. And it grows every time we say, not just "you're invited," but "this was made with you in mind."

Just like God has done for us.

Dormansland Parish Council



It has been a busy time for the Council. The last Thursday in April was our Annual Assembly where the focus was on St Piers School. We had pictorial displays from the students and the keynote speaker was Nazar Al-Khalili the Director of Finance for Young Epilepsy. We also had a contribution from one of the Trustees of the War Memorial Community Hall. Representatives from Fair Trade were there selling their goods. As usual, Councillor Richard Dandy held it all together on the day, with his MC skills and the delicious catering was courtesy of Councillor Cheryl Roux. We were delighted so many from our community attended what is always an important event in the year of the Council.

On the first Sunday in May, we held our first litter pick of 2025. We were disappointed so few turned up as this is the third year we have held this event on this Sunday and it has been a popular event previously. Those that did attend worked hard and we had twelve sacks of rubbish waiting to be collected by Tandridge Waste Engineers. Thank you to those volunteers who came forward to clean up our village.

A few days before the 8th May, one of the leaders of the boy scouts and a member of the Community contacted us and asked if they could make arrangements to light the beacon on the 80th Anniversary of VE day. We were able to use the Council Insurance to cover the event and Tandridge District Councillor Sir Nicholas White gave a very moving speech just prior to the beacon being lit. The event was well advertised and lots of people gathered round the beacon as the day light faded, enjoying the muted forties music. One of the boy-scouts lit the beacon and the whole event was a fitting tribute in memory of the people who had suffered or died in the 1939-45 war and the great jubilation, 80 years ago, that the thought of peace in Europe brought with it.

Our Council Meeting in May is the beginning of the year for the Council. We assign roles and responsibilities to each Councillor and review our policies. We decided to continue our current pattern of each Councillor taking it in turn to be chairperson for a month. These means that the tasks are shared more equally and there is no concept of hierarchy. This model has served us well since November and we were all in agreement with it going forward.

During this coming year there will be several tasks that will be our focus alongside the day to day running of the Parish.

The first is the Consultation for the Neighbourhood Plan. The parish council are pleased to announce that the Dormansland Neighbourhood Plan and Design Code will be open to a full public consultation from Friday 18th July to Friday 26th September. Details of how to take part will be delivered to every property in the parish and posted on the parish council website soon. There will be an open afternoon for you to inspect the Plan and Design Code at the Dormansland War Memorial Community Hall **from 1 to 6pm on Saturday 19 July 2025.** There will be members of the working group on hand to answer questions. Please add these dates to your diary.

Our second focus is to raise money for the playground. We have been allocated £115,000 from Tandridge District Council towards this project and the Parish has set aside £10,000. Our ambition is for the larger part of the playground to have a hard surface which will make the playground accessible to all and accessible in all weathers and all seasons. The playground working party has worked tirelessly to raise funds and the current scheme is the crowd funder which you can find on Facebook. Unfortunately, only two people have donated and although they have been very generous it is not enough to even make a dent in the cost of the enterprise. Please will you think how you might support this project in your own way, to make the Dormansland playground the best it might be. If the fund raised from donations and grants can pay for the ground surface the money from the Councils can pay for the play equipment.

Our third focus will be the proposed changes to local government being led by Central Government. As part of this, we are being approached by Tandridge to take on more of the amenities in the district, so we will be listening closely to what they have to say.

If you want to hear more about what your Parish Council is doing, the

meetings are open to the public on the first Wednesday of the month, except in August.

Chronicles From My Cabin #2

The run up to my departure for Mercy Ships was hectic to say the least – finishing work, sorting out my home, saying goodbye to family and friends, having numerous vaccinations as well as completing preparatory reading and online training.



Packing for a year was a whole new experience. The upside was a luggage allowance of two large suitcases. The downside was working out what to put in them. The ship is fully airconditioned and quite cool, so layers are essential. Even a blanket for the nights. Outside, the temperature is humid with temperatures ranging from about 21 to 30 degrees Celsius. Sierra Leone has a dry and a wet season and in my year of service, I am going to experience both.

While there is a well-stocked shop onboard, understandably there is a limited choice of many products – so we were advised to come with medicines we needed and any favourite toiletry brands. Plus, an umbrella/raincoat, spare glasses, spare shoelaces, a game to share, photos and things to decorate my cabin, as well as a few home comforts like snacks. It took a couple of days and no end of lists to work out what to take. I was grateful to finally close the suitcasesand even more so for the kind help of friends to lift them into the patiently waiting taxi.

There are no direct flights between London and Freetown so my journey to Sierra Leone took me via Brussels where I was fortunate to spot another crew member – easily visible from the Mercy Ships T-shirts we are all encouraged to wear. They not only help crew connect but can assist with a smoother transfer to the ship as local people recognise where you need to go and there is a well-established route for getting there. Overall, the journey took about 20 hours and included two taxis, two flights, and a catamaran before I got my first glimpse of the ship that is to be my home for the next year.

Next month I will share my first impressions and early experiences of life onboard. Until then, sending greetings from Sierra Leone. No need to send any sunshine as I hear you are all enjoying plenty of that in Dormansland. *Theresa White*


