# The Unknown

When my children were small, they found moving to a new school very stressful. My son told me that in his mind, secondary school was a big, scary place - with foreboding dark towers housing

fearsome teachers. But then we went along to the open evening. He met friendly staff and helpful students, whilst discovering welcome opportunities for sport. "I'm excited," he told me as we turned to leave. "There's so much to do here!"

I'm sure most of us will recognise this fear of the unknown. We create scenarios in our minds, wishing we could see what's coming next. I admit that I was a little nervous about moving to Dormansland last month. Would people be friendly? Will people avoid me when I walk with my two gentle-as-anything German shepherd dogs? As the new vicar, would it look wrong if I went to the local pub on the first day I arrived? Needless to say, I have yet to meet anyone in Dormansland who isn't friendly, helpful and kind to me and



my dogs. Is everyone really like that all the time?!

And then I considered what others' expectations of their new vicar might be. I wait to find out if I have lived up to any of them so far – especially the chap who told me that he had expected more of a Vicar of Dibley type! I couldn't work out if he was pleased or disappointed with who he has ended up with...

There's a man in the Bible who is commended for having faith in the face of the unknown. "By faith Abraham, when called to go to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going" (Hebrews 11:8).

That verse makes me smile because I must often look like I still don't know where I am going when I walk through Dormansland. And it's probably true – but I am gradually feeling more at home. The previously unknown is becoming more known. I think that although none of us can see what lies ahead and the unknown can be daunting, the key for me is in my faith that wherever I go and whatever I do, God goes with me. We know that God will walk each uncertain step with us until we see Him face to face in the city where He will dwell with us forever.

Here's a great prayer for anyone who needs reassurance for the future: Dear God, I am so thankful that I have a certainty within all of life's unknowns: You are with me, and You are everything I need.

# Dormansland Parish Council



A few updates following on from our meeting on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> June: We raised concern with Tandridge Council about noise levels from the recent Monster Truck Event at the racecourse and have received assurances that the Environmental Health and Licensing Departments are taking action to ensure noise levels are properly controlled at future events.

The public conveniences at the recreation ground have been re-opened and we are discussing with Tandridge about a possible full refurbishment.

The development of a station car park and affordable homes behind Dormans Station has once again come to a halt as the developer has gone into liquidation. The liquidators are securing the site, hoping to sell the project on.

The Parish Council will be hosting a stall at the carnival on 12<sup>th</sup> July when you can get more information about the consultation on the Neighbourhood Plan and Design Code for Dormansland. Α Neighbourhood plan gives communities direct power to develop a shared vision for their neighbourhood and shape the development and growth of their local area. The consultation opens on 18<sup>th</sup> July and runs through to 26<sup>th</sup> September. There will be an open forum at the War Memorial Community Hall from 1pm to 6pm on Saturday 19th July with members of the working group on hand to answer questions and of course there will be full details on our website.

We are carefully following the proposals for changes to local government that will result in Tandridge District Council being subsumed into a larger unitary authority. There remains much uncertainty over exactly what the new arrangements will be.

# A new organ for St John's church

Organs in churches still have a broad range of use, be it for ordinary services, concerts, weddings, funerals, special services of remembrance, etc, and like most churches, St John's Dormansland has had a number of organs during its existence as a church.



Records show that the first organ was installed in 1885, not long after the consecration of the church. By July 1930, the organ was 45 years old and would certainly be in need of major renovation. The archives for that time show Lesley Foad, who was the organist and choirmaster at the church reporting that the organ "was in a bad state of repair, could not be patched up, and needed reconstruction."

So, a second new organ was purchased in 1934, funded by a combination of Colonel Herbert Spender–Clay (married to Pauline, the daughter of the first Viscount Astor, of Greathead Manor) and donations from the Dormansland village residents. This instrument, built by J.W Walker and Sons, of London in 1934, remained in use until the terrible fire on October 26<sup>th</sup> 1990.The fire badly damaged many areas of the church, particularly the chancel where the organ pipework was located.With the exception of the console containing the keyboards, pedals and stops, the organ was completely destroyed.

Following the fire a new pipe organ was ordered from Harrison and Harrison organ builders of Durham, one of the UK's pre-eminent builders. However, the waiting list for the proposed organ was more than 2 years, and inflation in the meantime had the effect of increasing the quoted price.This together with rising church fire restoration costs eventually led to insufficient funds being available for an adequate instrument, and so the Harrison organ was never progressed.

However, in the late 1980's through the medium of emerging digital technology, very significant inroads had been made into successfully

copying the sound of an organ, at a fraction of the cost of a pipe instrument. Discussions were therefore held with Copeman Hart & Co, a UK builder of high quality 'pipe less' organs, using a digital system. The instrument was finally installed and commissioned in 1992, in time for the recommissioning of the church, by the Bishop of Croydon.

This first digital organ worked very reliably over three decades, with minor problems only emerging after some 32 years of use – not bad for a computer system. A decision was therefore taken in late 2024 by the Parochial Church Council, to seek to renew the computer, and audio systems. A contract was finally let to Church Organ World, one of the country's major builders of pipeless organs. Funding came from a combination of two grants, including one from the Surrey CC small project fund, and the churches own funds.

The organ was taken away to the builders workshops in Manchester in December 2024, and returned to the church along with the installation of a new audio system in May 2025. The organ employs some of the latest organ digital technology to be found across the globe, a technology that seeks to record and store the sound of individual pipes, from numerous pipe instruments. When the organ is played, these samples are played back, to produce a quite amazing pipe organ sound, undetectable from the real thing to most people.

The instrument comprises three manuals and pedals, and 56 speaking stops, capable of interpreting a wide range of musical styles.

It is expected that this rebuild of the 1992 Copeman Hart Organ will last for at least a further 30 years, representing remarkable value.
