

Autumn is nearly upon us and those of us who are often out and about dog-walking along the lanes and footpaths around Dormansland, will appreciate the need to carry various necessary items with us. We don't walk empty-handed.

At the very least we take some poo bags! Usually it's much more - especially in the summer months when I carry water for the dogs and myself, a ball and ball thrower, treats for good behaviour (for the dogs, not me...), dog leads, my phone in case of emergencies, and before I know it my backpack is full. The further I go the heavier it gets. Everything I think I need just slows me down.



And as September is upon us, so the children go back to school, weighed down by school bags crammed with books and PE kit a size bigger than the year before. Everything they need for just one day. And it's heavy.

I wonder what we are all carrying on our journey with God? What do we pack that God doesn't ask us to bring?

Pressure to make a difference, health worries, sorrow, pain for the world, bad habits, whatever is on our endless to-do list. We bring these problems with us to feel in control, but end up missing God's presence around us.

But God didn't make us to carry it all; every tragedy happening on every part of the world, every worry about the future, as if it were all on us. God calls us to compassion and action where we can make a difference but we are not called to bear the weight of the world's brokenness on our shoulders. That's what Jesus does for us through the

cross. He asks us to give our burdens to him and share the journey.

Take a moment today to imagine handing over the burdens that weigh you down to God, and let him carry them for you.

Therefore since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us.



Dormansland Parish Council



The Parish Council held its 282nd meeting this July, chaired by Cllr Keith Coleman under the Council's rotating leadership scheme. The meeting brought together Councillors, District and County representatives, and local stakeholders to discuss the progress and wellbeing of our village.

Infrastructure across the Parish remains a key priority as we work with District and County councilors. Resurfacing works have now been completed in The Meades, Newhache and Ladbrook Hurst, though works continue in Locks Meadow.

The Council has approved funding for a new Gateway sign at the junction of the High Street and Mutton Hill, it's designed to reduce vehicle speed entering the village.

Residents will be pleased to know that progress continues on the refurbishment of playground facilities, fundraising has continued over the summer months to raise money for the playground refurbishment. The crowd funding page raised over £500 and the name a teddy stall at the carnival was successful in creating awareness of the project and adding another £100 to the venture. The fundraisers are applying for further grants with the assistance of Tandridge District Council. If residents wish to make a contribution please contact the Parish Clerk.

The Neighbourhood Plan has reached several key milestones. Planning law enables communities to add additional policies tailored to their area, and this plan sets out Dormansland's vision.

If you haven't yet reviewed it, please visit www.dormanslandplan.co.uk or the Parish Council website. Leaflets have been distributed, and we were pleased to speak with many of you at our Carnival stall and our dedicated session on 19th July at the War Memorial Hall, which saw a healthy turnout. We were also delighted to see the BBC featured the consultation in a recent article.

Consultation on the Dormansland Neighbourhood Plan and the associated Design Code closes on **26th September 2025**. Comments may be submitted via email to parishclerk@dormansland.org.uk. Please see more details on following page.

If adopted, both documents will become part of the Development Plan and be a "material consideration" used by Tandridge District Council when determining planning applications.

Expenditure on grass cutting and weed control was also reviewed. The Council acknowledged their importance in maintaining village appearance—a point frequently raised in resident surveys alongside speeding.

Council members also reviewed Dormansland's contribution to the Tandridge District Council Settlement Survey, submitting final amendments to ensure an accurate representation of local services and education provision.

Lastly, due to low turnout during the spring litter pick, Councillors agreed to postpone the next event until May 2026, aligning it with the National Litter Pick Day to encourage greater participation. The Public Consultation runs until **Friday 26 September (5pm)** and the Plan is available on the Dormansland Neighbourhood Plan website, which also holds the supplementary documents www.dormanslandplan.co.uk/

Alongside the Plan is a Design Code which is also open for public consultation. It has been produced in conjunction with the Plan and is intended to be a supplementary planning document, to be adopted at the same time as the DNP, following the successful completion of the Neighbourhood Plan regulations.


Also a big thank you to everyone who organised the coffee afternoon, and battled through the heavy rain and powercut to make it a great success!
