From Revd Annie

Let's be a community that restores that which is broken

My daughter once brought a drug dealer home with her...(don't ask!) I will explain but first let me say why I wanted to tell you all this story...

Some of you may be aware that the beautiful seating area in the church garden was recently vandalised which was upsetting to all of us at St John's Church, especially those who had carefully built it as an offering to the community of Dormansland.

As a church we discussed how we ought to respond to this mindless act. Many wanted to find out who it was so we could talk to them and explain the distress they had caused and see if we could help them. Others wanted to put pictures all over Facebook and The Village Voice and ask folk to tell the police if they thought it might be their neighbours who had done it.

There were plenty of suggestions that didn't sit too comfortably, and what made me rather uncomfortable was the number of times the perpetrators were referred to in conversations as 'youths' or 'teenage boys'. Maybe it was, but let's make sure we are not being judgemental. What is the right response we asked ourselves?

We decided that we need to restore that which is broken – our lovely garden area, into something even more beautiful. We are inviting one and all of our Dormansland residents to come and join us in a Rake and Cake event on Saturday 4th October between 10am and 12 noon. Please come and bring a plant, a trowel, a fork, gloves, a child (yes, do bring the children!) and help us to weed, plant and repair the area. And in return, we will supply tea, coffee, squash and CAKE!!

Let's not let this anti-social behaviour infect us with anything other than love for our neighbour and a willingness to help put it right.

Oh, and my daughter and the drug dealer....

It was in her more rebellious days as a teenager and among her rather dubious friends who she sat on the wall at the corner of the street with, was a young chap – a youth - who sold drugs to anyone who wanted them.

My daughter's choice of friends left me feeling very nervous each time she went out but other than explaining how to be careful – which I did – or keeping her under lock and key – which I didn't...I felt rather powerless. I have to say that if you ever feel powerless, turn to prayer as my goodness it works!

I did pray for her lots and often and then one day she came home and announced that Charlie the drug dealer had been talking to her about Jesus and she had told him to come over to talk to me. I suggested that next week might be a good time but she said no, he was on his way over right now!

Thirty seconds later the door bell rang and a tall chap with hoodie and bicycle came in (he said he had brought his bicycle into the house because it might get stolen) and my daughter went out and left me on my own with him. I can't say I felt relaxed.

We did have a long chat. I asked him if he took drugs and he looked at me as if I was mad and said 'No way! Absolutely not!'

He explained that he only sold drugs because his parents couldn't afford to keep him and he had been in prison before for a minor offence which meant no one would give him a job. So what was he supposed to do to earn money?

I asked him what his interests were and it became obvious that he was keen to explore the world of music technology. To cut a long story short, that youth decided that day to stop dealing drugs, he applied for a music tech course at Liverpool Hope University, was offered a place and has turned his life around.

Not all youth are bad people. Even the ones who at first glance appear to be. Often they are the victim of circumstances that are out of their control and they can't see a way out. Let's be a community that restores that which is broken – whether it is damaged church seating areas or human beings in need, into something more beautiful. See you on 4th...





Dormansland Parish Council



Following the August break, the parish council has had its most recent meeting in the first week of September. Please note that for the rest of the year, the parish council and planning meetings will be held in the Meeting Room at the Baptist Chapel; the next meeting is on **Wednesday**, 1st October, with planning at 6pm and the council meeting starting at 6.30pm. Agendas can be found up to a week before the meeting, on the parish website and on the parish notice boards in the 'Rec' and in Dormans Park.

We have to inform you that Jon Ford, has resigned from the parish council; in the short time he has served, he has enthusiastically shared his knowledge and experience for the good of the parish and his valued contribution will be missed. We have started the process of filling the vacancy.

The recent planning application for a solar farm on agricultural land at Haxted has generated a huge amount of local interest. The parish planning committee has sent in objections citing harm to the green belt, flood risk, harm to protected habitats and heritage assets, amongst a number of other objections. The parish council are not opposed to solar power generation but feel in the case of the Dormansland parish area, there are other sites, closer to the electricity grid and large urban areas, which are less harmful to the openness of the countryside, or they can be put onto the industrial, retail and residential buildings where the electricity is used. The application is likely to be decided at the end of the year, so if you would like to look at the details and submit your comments, the application number is 2025/644.

The parish council have been assured that the broken slide in the 'Rec' will be repaired and the much-needed repair to the toilets was thankfully undertaken before the Carnival. The planned refurbishment of the children's playground failed to get grant funding this time round, but they are now working on applying to other funding streams to

supplement the Tandridge budget, so that the village gets a state-of-the-art inclusive play area with lots of additional exciting equipment that will cater for children of all abilities.

Highways issues are often reported to the parish clerk, but you can report these directly yourself to Surrey Highways on a link to the Fix-My - Street website, where you can upload photos and pinpoint the exact location of the pothole or blocked gully on their map. It is a much more direct way of flagging the problem – go to www.tellus.surreycc.gov.uk/. If it is an emergency, like a tree blocking the road, or roadwork traffic lights not working, please call 0300 200 1003, which is open 24/7.

Ed. I know this article has appeared in local publications before but it seems fitting to include again as it will be of interest to newer residents I'm sure.

The Dormans Land War Memorial Hall

World War I, also known as the Great War, lasted for four years, three months, and fourteen days. These years had taken their toll on local families, many of whom had lost loved ones, not only during the conflict but also in the years following, due to their wounds or illnesses caused by the intense bombing and mustard gas. Family life in Dormans Land had been filled with worry and uncertainty, and the need for fun and laughter was in the minds of many once the war had ended. The feeling of freedom led to the building of memorial halls, which sprang up in many towns and villages. These venues offered solace and a return to normality for families of the fallen and returning service members, providing places where bands played and people danced. Lt Col Herbert Henry Spender Clay, M.C., C.M.G., of Ford Manor, generously contributed the land for the Dormans Land War Memorial Hall, and the building was funded by local subscription.

The official opening of the Memorial Hall took place in the afternoon of Saturday, the 9th of October 1920, by General Henry Sinclair Horne, G.C.B., K.C.M.G., 1st Baron Horne of Stirkoke, a highly distinguished British Army officer who commanded the British First Army in France in 1916. A Guard of Honour was presented by the 4th Battalion, the Queen's Royal West Surrey Regiment.

Several villagers volunteered to form a committee to establish a club for residents to join. Club members paid a yearly subscription and in return were given a membership card, which offered cheaper entry to functions and subsidised drinks at the bar. The subscription, along with regular profit making events, such as whist drives, dances, and jumble sales, was a positive way to raise the necessary funds for the upkeep of the hall.

Known affectionately by all as The Club, this establishment became an important asset to the village, being a popular venue for many villagers. Between the wars, old folk's dinners and children's parties

were held at Christmas time. The hall became a much needed morale booster during the years of the Second World War, holding parties, etc. During the 1950s and 60s, local groups often played at the weekends to a well attended audience, and pantomimes and band concerts were also very popular.

Into the 1970s, bingo nights were a particular favourite, with people from Lingfield, East Grinstead and Edenbridge attending; the hall would always be packed to the gunwales. Throughout the evening, fag breaks were organised, when the side doors would be opened and people would spill out onto Hollow Lane, nearly emptying the hall, to frantically finish a complete cigarette before the next session started. Many would take chairs out with them only to have to take them back in – it was always a fun-packed night. The well-attended jumble sales with those impenetrable lines of feisty ladies with their deadly elbows, eagerly scrambling for bargains, would have been a challenge for Big Daddy and Giant Haystacks, the popular wrestlers of the 1970s.

Sadly, these village social events became less supported than in previous years, and eventually the hall lost its popularity. The days of The Club are long gone, and there was a time when the building stood empty, but fortunately, during the last few years, a group of volunteers have dedicated their free time to give the building a new lease of life. Our hall has risen like a phoenix from the ashes, and once again it stands proudly to serve the community.

The Memorial Cross in the churchyard of St. John's Church, Dormans Land, names 49 men who died in the conflict. Give a thought and pay tribute to those valiant men who lost their lives for us and to whom the hall has stood as a memorial for 105 years.

BLOOD!



We have all seen it, whether you have cut your finger in the kitchen or you work in the Emergency Services and NHS, we have seen plenty of it. However, how many of us have donated blood? Next week I will be making my 55th donation. A little bit of important information that might make some of you consider donating.

On average 4,300 donations are needed everyday to meet the needs of patients in England but only 2% of people who are eligible to donate blood actually give.

30% of blood donors stop donating each year. So, 140,000 new donors are required to replace those that can no longer give.

Every new donor who joins is helping to make the supply of blood stronger and more dependable, which means people have a better chance of getting the blood they need.

Please consider giving blood, the staff are helpful and afterwards complimentary drinks and biscuits await you. You book your appointment online by visiting <u>blood.co.uk</u> and it takes about I hour of your time. I know we are all busy but that's not a long time when you consider you are doing something really important to help save another person. I personally have never had any issues before, during or after giving my pint, only once did I see a young lady feeling a little faint after her donation but staff did a wonderful job looking after her. After giving blood I often get updated as to where my blood has went, sometimes to a ward looking after seriously ill children or to a cancer ward, knowing this makes it all the more worthwhile.



News from the Rockets


