From Revd Annie Generosity

Deep down, every one of us is generous. We all give our money, our time, and our energy away to someone. The problem is that some people are only generous for their own benefit. Even when they're "giving," they're really only looking for something in return.

Over the past few weeks I have seen some incredible generosity from the Dormansland community – mostly given without fanfare or expectation of a reward.

St John's Church held a Rake and Cake event which was our response to the mindless vandalism in the church garden. On the morning of Saturday 4th October over 40 people from the community arrived wielding spades, trowels, rakes, plants, children...and joined us in repairing the damaged garden area. You were all absolute heroes. It was blowing a gale and yet everyone worked so hard. Thank you so much for your generosity.







On Sunday 5th October we held our Harvest Festival and not only did we collect a huge amount of food for the Foodbank but we also had a collection in aid of the Farming Network Community which supports farmers and their families who struggle through difficult times. No one asked for anything in return for their donations.







The War Memorial Hall stands as testimony to the generosity of so many in our community who give their time and resources for the benefit of others. We even have the new weekly Dormansland Youth Hub starting there on Thursday 6th November. I could go on....

Jesus, of course, was the most generous person who ever lived, giving His life for people who did not deserve it and who could never repay Him. For all of us, our lives should be marked by radical generosity. We should give financially when appropriate, being radically openhanded when a need is presented. But generosity with money is only a start. Generous people see the needs of others around them as opportunities to share the love of God, to invest in others, and to build genuine relationships.

Sincere, Biblical generosity gives to others without expecting to ever be paid back.

We all know the story of when Jesus took one boy's lunch and multiplied it so there was enough food to feed everyone present. The accounts say there were five thousand men present, which means there might have also been an equal number of women and children present. They weren't important enough to be counted in those days!

Jesus could have warned the crowd in the morning that they should bring a packed lunch. He could have shrugged off the needs of those people, saying, "Not My problem." The disciples knew that the people would be hungry, and they offered a sensible suggestion to Jesus: Send everybody home before dark.

But Jesus didn't send the people away. He provided for them. That's the generosity of Jesus. He gave when He didn't have to and with no expectation of anything in return.

Would others consider you a generous person? Make it a point this month to be intentionally generous with someone in need.

Prayer: God, thank You for the generosity You displayed when You sent Jesus to die on the cross. Thank you for the generosity of our Dormansland community in so many ways. Show us how we may generously give of our resources to help those around us who are in need. Amen.

Dormansland Parish Council



At our most recent Council Meeting in early October, the Councillors discussed the state of disrepair of the roads in the Parish. Whilst several roads had been repaired recently there are still several, including Hollow Lane, West Street and Locks Meadow that still need work. Following on from the Council Meeting, four of your Councillors met with the Surrey County Council Highways Liaison team to better understand how roads are assessed and prioritised for repair. Whilst it is recognised that there are limited finances available for road works it was resolved to continue to pursue Surrey County Council to ensure that our worst roads appear on the maintenance schedule.

Residents can record their own highways issues directly with Surrey Highways on a link to the Fix-My -Street website, where you can upload photos and pinpoint the exact issues on their map. It is a much more direct way of flagging the problem – go to www.tellus.surreycc.gov.uk.

The Council also discussed the issue of speeding through the Village, particularly on the High Street, Plough Road and Dormans Road. We are hopeful that the second speed activated sign, on Plough Road, will be operational shortly and it is felt that these signs do have an impact upon speeds. As a first step to address the issue, the Council have resolved to commission a speed survey to assess the scale of the issue.

The Council have also been active in liaising with Tandridge District Council Planning Enforcement Team in relation to the unauthorised developments in a field just of St Pier's Lane, including the re-routing of a public footpath. Enforcement Officers have attended the site to cease work and are now working to ensure that the site is returned to its former condition.

The second round of Grants to local groups or organisations will now be considered by the Council with the application window now open and closing on the 21st November. Please contact the Parish Clerk for an

application form. The applications will be considered by the Council at their December meeting.

We have commenced the process of filling the vacant Councillor position, following Jon Ford's resignation, by co-option and anyone interested in the role should request an application form from the Parish Clerk – <u>parishclerk@dormansland.org.uk</u> The closing date for applications is 15th January 2026 with an appointment made at the February 2026 Full Council Meeting.

Please note that for the rest of the year and into 2026, the parish council and planning meetings will be held in the Meeting Room at the Baptist Chapel; the next meeting is on Wednesday, the 3rd of December, with planning at 6pm and the council meeting starting at 6.30pm. Agendas can be found up to a week before the meeting, on the parish website and on the parish notice boards in the 'Rec' and in Dormans Park.

News from your local Ramblers

It's not just toddlers who love mud – we Ramblers do too, and there's often a lot of it about in November. But please don't worry, our local walks often include a warning if

conditions are challenging and with decent boots and support from your local branch of the Ramblers – East Surrey Walkers - you'll be fine.

We walk for fun and fitness and, of course, the chat. We are walkers of all ages from all sorts of backgrounds – what we have in common is a love of the great outdoors. Our programme includes 'ambles' – easier and shorter walks – which are great for newcomers or those getting fit.

We organise 50 guided walks for all abilities from 3 to 10 miles every three months. Start time is normally 10:00am. No need to book ... just turn up and have fun. You're welcome to join us for a couple of walks before thinking about becoming a member.

Our leaders are all experienced and we always have a nominated back-marker to ensure we all keep together and no one drops out without warning.

Dogs are welcome on leads.

If you're interested, your first step should be to check out our programme here on the web at www.eastsurreywalkers.org.uk

Walks are colour-coded: Blue: Easy/Amble (about 1.5 miles per hour); White: Leisurely (2.0mph); Green: Moderate (2.5mph); Purple Strenuous (3.5mph). All these walks are 'circular' – so we finish where we start, often near a pub that does good food. The calendar also has a 'map view' so you can check the start-finish nearest to you.

Two walks stand out for locals: on **Wednesday 19th November at Dormansland**, parking and meeting at 10:00am in Ford Manor Road.

This is an easy walk on tarmac driveways, bridle paths and farm tracks. Past Ford Manor, then a very gentle climb up to far-reaching views, zigzagging back through pretty woodland and farmland.

On Thursday 27th November there's an amble starting and finishing in Lingfield. Park in Gun Pit Road at 10:00am for an easy stroll through farmland around Lingfield. Optional drinks at The Star.

Remembering Frances (Fran) Dobson

Robert Powell, Fran's son, asked that we make mention of his mum. On behalf of his sister Kaylene and himself he writes.....

Our Mum, Fran, passed away peacefully on Friday 19th September, aged 87, at Abbeygate Rest Home in Crowland, Lincolnshire. Our family lived in Dormansland for nearly 50 years, from 1970, until Mum and our Stepfather Bob moved from the village in 2017, to be near Kaylene in their older age.

We moved to Holly Cottage in Dormansland as a family shortly after I was born in 1970, as our father, Philip Powell, worked at Gatwick Airport as an Airport Fire Officer. Unfortunately our father died in an accident in 1975 while we lived in Bahrain, and he is laid to rest in Dormansland churchyard. After this traumatic event Mum brought us back to Dormansland where friends in the village and nearby family helped us grieve and rebuild. Fran brought a Shop at the bottom of Dormansland High Street and opened the Maid Marian Convenience Store. It is as the Proprietor of the Maid Marian that Fran will probably be most fondly remembered in the Dormansland community.

Fran met Bob Dobson in the village and they were married in St Johns in 1981. Mum and Bob spent many happy years living in Dormansland as a family. Later in the 1990's when Fran's Stepfather Jock passed away, her mother, Voilet, also joined us in Dormansland. Both Jock and Voilet, our Grandparents, are also laid to rest in St Johns.

Both Mum and Bob made many friends in Dormansland and were active in the church and community, especially through Maid Marian, supporting residents in Newhache, the Village Fete and as a School Govenor of Dormansland Primary School.

The growth of larger supermarkets and a horrible robbery of the store eventually led to the difficult decision to close Maid Marian and Fran retired. Fran and Bob moved into a Bungalow in the High Street for their retirement, but Fran continued to play an active part in the community, being a regular Cleaner at St Johns and also a part-time Carer at the College of St. Barnabas.

My sister and I moved away from Dormansland, my sister to Crowland

and myself working across the Middle East, but we have fond memories of returning regularly to visit Mum and Bob. Eventually to support them both in their older age, they moved to Crowland in Lincolnshire, to be nearer Kaylene and their granddaughters Lucy and Stefanie, but the wrench from Dormansland was difficult for them both. Bob passed away in February 2023 after suffering from Alzheimers and since then Fran had been living with Kaylene. A short illness over the summer meant that Fran needed additional care, and she passed away peacefully after being resident in Abbeygate Care home for only two months.

Chronicles From My Cabin #4

Greetings from Freetown, Sierra Leone and apologies for the lengthy radio silence.
Our annual maintenance period on board MV Global Mercy (GLM) was full of adventure and change.

We sailed for Cadiz in June after a sad end to the field service with the death of a young crew member from malaria. Everyone was ready for a change of scene and a new ship season of annual maintenance.

Hospital crew disembarked and were replaced with project managers and all manner of technical crew including plumbers, carpenters, engineers and electricians. They arrived with fresh energy and enthusiasm for the tasks ahead. Many are regulars and return every year to work on the ship during this period of refit and repair. The atmosphere was friendly but focused. There's a deadline and a finite period for maintenance. This year was also special with a month in dry dock, a first for the GLM as it only occurs every five years. Being on board as a ship goes into dry dock and is raised above the water line was not on my bucket list plans but it was an interesting experience and one I'm glad I didn't miss.

By August, the ship had been stripped of barnacles and given a fresh coat of paint on the outside and was looking shiny and ready for action on the inside too. Carpets had been cleaned, galley floors repaired, engines checked, hospital equipment recalibrated and the pharmacy restocked. We sailed back into Freetown, Sierra Leone in high spirits having made good time in the calm waters. The solitude at sea with only dolphins, turtles and flying fish for company, plus ten days with limited internet coverage, offered a peaceful interlude to the frenzied maintenance activity we left behind and the busy start to field service which lay ahead on arrival.

Back in Freetown we embarked over 300 day crew within the first week. All waiting eagerly to rejoin the ship and become part of our extended family on board again. It was wonderful to welcome them back. A new Captain and hospital crew arrived, some with their families so the focus

was on induction and orientation. Plus a sense of anticipation as the Academy classrooms were opened and the hospital was unpacked, deep cleaned and prepared for use.

Our first patients arrived in September and as I write this update we are running four operating rooms offering vital surgery in a range of areas which are currently not available, or only on a very limited basis, in Sierra Leone. We have hosted visits from both the Vice President and local Major who spoke passionately about the changes being made to healthcare in the country. They expressed gratitude to Mercy Ships for the part the organisation is playing in facilitating some of those changes. Through training and mentorship arrangements with local hospitals, support is being offered to physiotherapists, dentists, technicians, nurses and many other practitioners in their development. It is wonderful to see and learn about these sustainable programs which will make a lasting difference long after the ship sails.

For now, it has been a rewarding and exhausting few months. I feel stretched to my limits often as my days are long and hard but there is joy in all of them and so much to be grateful for. As our final period of field service gets underway I hope I can share the work being done here by our dedicated crew and you enjoy reading about it as much as I am enjoying experiencing it.
