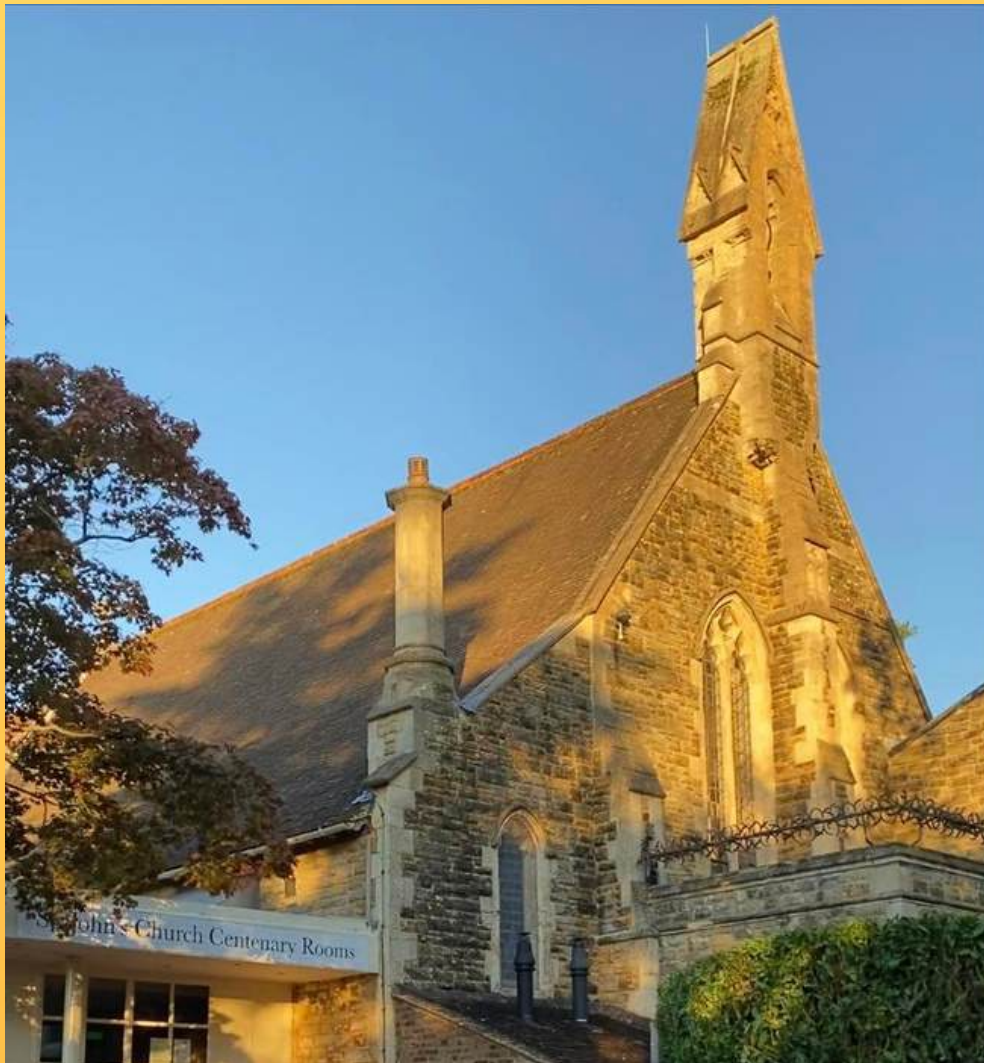

Joy!

I am told that I have a strange sense of humour. That may be true of course but alongside my urges to giggle sometimes at a rather inappropriate moment, I do think that I take my faith very seriously.

I was very interested recently in the sense of humour of the Artemis II astronauts who returned to Earth from space – which in itself is an intense process that begins with the spacecraft de-orbiting, plunging through the atmosphere at blinding speeds, and ending with a parachute-assisted splashdown in the ocean – to one of the funniest press conferences I've seen.

And during their mission when they lost contact with ground control as they passed round the far side of the moon, and the world held its breath... when they were the furthest humans have ever been from Earth and they had just 40 minutes to capture critical data. Where did they start?



They ate biscuits!

Surely this was the time to get on with the job? Tens of thousands of people involved, years in the making, an estimated \$39bn. Yet they took a moment for fun.

Evidently this was the crew's established way of working. As astronaut Jeremy Hansen explained, 'We have a term we coined a long time ago: the "joy train.'" There are many times we're not on the joy train, but we're committed to getting back on.'

Imagine being stuck in a space-going campervan with three

for 10 days. I'd lose my smile fast. But in that capsule, the crew had an Easter egg hunt, ate 'Orbit' chewing gum, and made spoof videos.

You and I may not be on a lunar voyage, but we have a mission as transcendent as Artemis II's. Whether we're on Zoom, caring for family, or fixing pipes, we are part of a history-defining team. The head of the cosmos says we're to be salt and light in the world (John 15:13-14). Christians are boots on the ground, pointing to God's new creation with faith, hope and love.

Like a teaspoon of salt or a tea-light, the good news is, a little goes a long way. When work feels tough, when our crew has different priorities or difficult attitudes, it's then that small moments of joy make a big difference.

Jesus' mission was on an interstellar scale – 'save humanity in three years.' But he too had time for joy. He BBQed, celebrated weddings, and was a comedic storyteller – imagine walking around with a plank in your eye (Matthew 7:3-5)! His arrival was announced as 'good news of great joy' (Luke 2:10). Through his life and resurrection, Jesus fulfilled his destiny as a joy bringer. Now we're invited to join him.

How can you make time for small regular moments of joy this month? What fun can you join in with?

The ground is very dry at the moment with no significant rain forecast soon. Anything newly planted will need to be well watered in and then given a good drink once a week until established.

Next year the Sale will be restricted to Fruit and Vegetables with some annuals such as sweetpeas but the following year we intend to be back to selling everything again.

As spring unfurls its many colours and the warmth of summer beckons, Dormansland is currently awash in a kaleidoscope of colour. We owe this seasonal splendour to the cherry trees throughout our village and the dedicated residents whose horticultural artistry brings such vibrancy to our streets. Once again, our communal planters are adorned with geraniums; their buds are already blushing with life and promise a lavish display as the sun grows stronger.

The Annual Parish Assembly

On the 30th of April, the Parish Council convened at the Dormansland War Memorial and Community Hall for the Annual Parish Assembly. The evening featured distinguished guest speakers Catherine Sayer, Leader of Tandridge District Council, and Hannah Welton of St Piers. While our local MP, Claire Coutinho, had hoped to join us, a sudden shift in her schedule unfortunately prevented her attendance.

Hannah Welton offered an enlightening vision of the future, describing the thoughtful integration of St Piers with the villages of Dormansland and Lingfield. She detailed how the evolution of the estate and the strategic sale of land have provided the vital resources needed to modernise the college, ensuring its students enjoy a vibrant and contemporary home.

Catherine Sayer addressed the broader horizon, discussing the impending transition of devolution and the Council's management of these structural changes. Catherine outlined how the district was moved forward with its own Local Plan and highlighted the challenges now being faced by local councils to meet Central Government's requirements for new housing.

Honouring a Local Hero

It is with great pride that the Dormansland Parish Council announces the 2026 recipient of the Local Hero Award: David Birchall, Chair of the

Memorial War and Community Hall. This accolade recognises David's tireless devotion to restoring the hall as the beating heart of our community, overseeing its remarkable regeneration and refurbishment. In recognition of his service, the Council has presented David with a £100 gift, which, in the spirit of the award, he will donate to a charity of his choosing. The Parish Council are arranging for a Local Hero board to be installed in the hall where the names of the Local Hero's will be recorded.

Community Care in Action

The annual village litter pick, meticulously organised by Cllr Taylor, saw a dedicated band of volunteers gather at St John's Church. Armed with high-visibility vests and collection tools, the team set out to polish our streets to a shine. The morning's efforts concluded at the Baptist Church, where participants were welcomed with well-earned refreshments. Our sincere thanks go to Cllr Taylor for spearheading this vital initiative, and to Cllr Coleman for graciously providing the storage facilities that make such an endeavour possible.

Proposed housing development at Farindons

The parish council is exploring the option of seeking professional planning advice regarding the Farindon's proposal for a substantial housing development. We have approached the company who were so helpful on the Neighbourhood Plan to see how much any advice would cost. We will be discussing this at our next council meeting.

Councillor Vacancies

Dormansland Parish Council continue the search for new Councillors to join the Parish Council. We are seeking passionate, dedicated residents to join the Parish Council and become the architects of our village's future. Our village needs your voice. Step up to a seat on the Parish Council and take a hands-on role in the decisions that define our community. Don't just live in our parish - shape it. We are looking for proactive residents ready to join the Parish Council and drive the positive future of our village.

As we look toward the May 2027 Parish Council elections, Dormansland stands at an exciting crossroads. While several of our

long-standing 'stalwarts' have earned a well-deserved retirement from the Council, their departure will leave a vital opening for the next generation of local leaders.

The stakes are high: Without a District Council, decisions about our streets and fields will be made by distant officials with no connection to our village. News from Lingfield Surgery

Patient Participation Group (PPG)

Non attendance. The number of people who don't turn up for booked appointments with a doctor at Lingfield Surgery continues to cause concern. From 1st January to 30th April, the number of people who did not attend surgery appointments was **648**. If you find you can't make a doctor's appointment, please let the surgery know so they can offer the appointment to someone else.

Referral follow up. Referrals sent to the local hospital are the responsibility of the patients to chase where necessary as the surgery has no control over hospital appointments. The surgery appreciates that some patients have had issues with doing the chasing as it can take some time to contact the relevant department. But it is the same issue if the staff at the surgery chase – it means a member of staff can be on the phone for some time which takes them away from dealing with other patient needs. When the surgery issues a referral, they will send you a text and/or email providing the contact details of the referral, but they can only do so if your details are up to date, so please always check!

Prescriptions. Don't forget to allow extra time for your prescriptions in bank holiday weeks. Any bank holiday adds an extra day to the time it takes to issue a prescription. The surgery advises that patients should request prescriptions at least seven – 10 days before they are due.

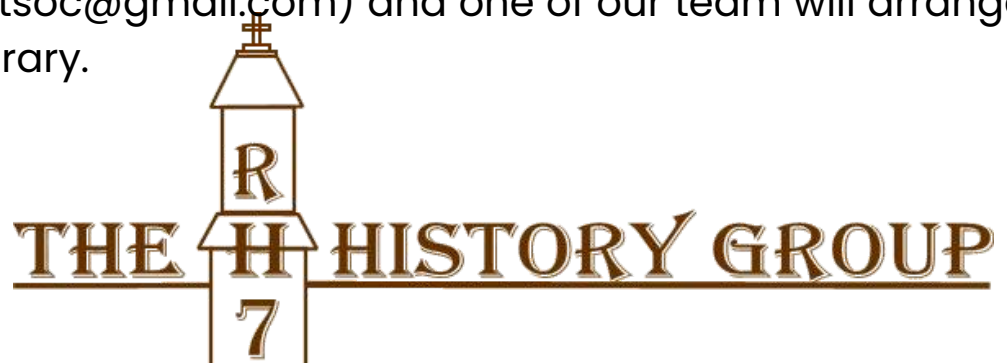

Thank you to everyone who came along to our plant sale last month – we loved seeing you!

May is an important month for WI when we discuss issues which affect women. This year we discussed two resolutions which we hope will become issues of campaigning around the country.

Accessible free public toilet facilities – WI plans to campaign for more clean, free public toilets.

Action on women’s homelessness – This campaign will ask government to take measures to reduce women’s homelessness and improve temporary accommodation.

After much discussion, both resolutions were supported by our members and our vote will be added to the national vote next month.

The second resolution was complemented by a moving account of the work of the charity, “I Choose Freedom” which runs refuges for women and children fleeing domestic abuse.

Next month we are looking forward to a talk on “The Indian Diaspora”. Women over eighteen are very welcome at our meetings, which are free of charge to visitors. If you would like to discover what WI has to offer, just come along to our next meeting – you will be made very welcome. It’s on **Thursday 11th June at 7:30** in The Parish Room.

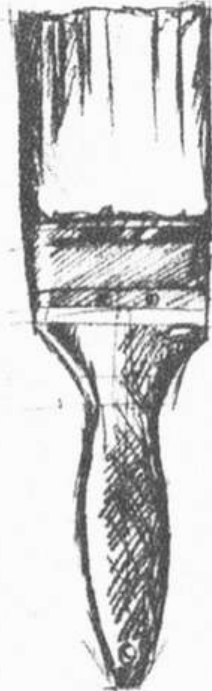

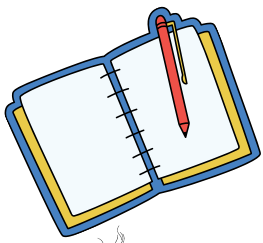
