Thought for September

All the trees of the forest will know that I the Lord bring down the tall tree and make the low tree grow tall. Ezekiel 17:24

Creationtide or the Season of Creation is the period in the annual church calendar, from 1st September to 4th October, dedicated to God as Creator and Sustainer of all life. During Creationtide Christians around the world are encouraged to pray for, and care for, God's good creation. This is a season to reflect on our place and role in the world that God has made, and to let that inform our faith.

There is a large tree in the middle of the Recreation Ground in Dormansland which I see every morning from my window. I'm no arborist but I know that it provides a safe space for squirrels and crows, ivy and ferns, owls, spiders and countless insects. It's an old tree and its branches overhang and have given shade to hundreds of people during the hot summer this year. I often think about what joys and sorrows, what love, and grief have been shared under its shade by those who lived here before me? You might be used to trees by now but for me this is such a blessing!

Thomas Merton, a great nature lover, wrote that "A tree gives glory to God by being a tree. For in being what God means it to be it is obeying him." From the Garden of Eden onwards, trees have always held a place of special significance for humans.

And I remember two years ago the huge outpouring of righteous fury across news channels and social media, and my own heart, when we awoke to the news that the iconic 'Sycamore Gap' tree on Hadrian's Wall had been illegally felled. This was a crime committed with no obvious motive, against a much beloved natural feature. This was cultural vandalism and emotions were stirred.

Emotions were also stirred when Jesus arrives in Jericho at the beginning of Luke19, and he looks up into the branches of a sycamore tree on the side of the road and sees a small man. Zacchaeus may well have been accused of first-century Palestinian cultural vandalism because he was a tax collector for the Romans. And his reputation among the community made Jesus' decision to go and eat at his home more than a little surprising! And as a result, Zacchaeus is transformed, making restitution for wrongs, and committing himself to serving the common good.

What does cultural vandalism of God's creation look like in your context? Maybe sitting under a tree in your own garden will help us to search inwards and upwards as well as outwards to our community. Spend some time under a tree today. What stories do you notice playing out there...Revd Annie
